Resolution #1: Extracurricular Activity Funds

- Presented & approved by PAC Executive
- Increase funding from \$10-\$20 for student field trips to cover cost of transportation (bus rental)
- Provide \$1703\* to purchase new volleyball net
- $\circ$  Provide \$2300\* to purchase new numbered jerseys for school teams
- Source of funds: Gaming grant
- Vote: Majority yes (motion passed)

Resolution #2: Technology Refresh

- Presented & approved by PAC Executive
  - Provide funds to purchase 30 new iPads for use by students
  - Total expected cost \$20,000
- Previous PAC funded technology is outdated (6-7 years old) and to ensure consistent and equal quality of learning for all students, refresh is needed
  - Need is being magnified by reduced number of students able to bring their own devices
  - Higher needs also because there are more applications & software for students to use (cross-curricular)
- Vote: Unanimous (motion passed)

#### PAC Roadmap Planning

- PAC Executive will prepare multi-year project roadmap for fund allocation and sustaining support provided by PAC
  - o Long term "wish list"
    - Convert playground woodchips to rubber/foam mats
    - Regular technology refreshes
