1. Call to Order and Introduction of attendees: Hailey Wong, 6:35pm

2. Committee Reports:

- a. Hot Lunch Marsella Lim and Angie Harianto
 - Hot Lunch will now be every Thursday, up from last year's twice a month
 - Introduction of Munch-a-Lunch Online Ordering this year
 - Parents are encouraged to order full sessions of Hot Lunch at one time, but individual orders are accepted up to 9 days prior to the Hot Lunch date
 - a hot lunch can be cancelled up to 9 days prior to the Lunch date and the student's account will be credited for the meal



- b. **Book Fair** JoAnn Ng and Michelle Chien (absent)
 - this Fall's Book Fair is set for Thurs, Oct. 25th and Fri, Oct. 26th in the school library
 - the Book Fair is parent-run to raise funds for PAC, and acquire new books for the library
 - volunteer forms will be sent home by the end of the month, and a schedule will be posted closer to the Book Fair dates

c. Fruit and Vegetable - Sherly Heck

- government funded program providing fresh local fruit and vegetables to all students(K - Gr 7), roughly twice a month
- deliveries arrive on Mondays, with distribution to classes the following Tuesday morning
- parent volunteers are needed to help with washing and distributing of produce on Tuesday mornings

d. Milk/Dairy - Winnie Huang and Margaret Szeto

- government funded program in association with Dairy Farmers of BC providing milk and soy milk to students from K to Gr 5
- parent volunteers are needed to help distribute the milk to students, roughly twice a month, on Wednesdays before lunch

e. Sports Day - Hailey Wong and Marsella Lim

- held the third week of May
- PAC provides recess snacks (watermelon) to all students
- PAC also offers concession sales during recess and lunch, and hot lunch options (fundraisers)

f. Grade 7 Grad Coordinators - Marsella Lim and Angie Harianto

 helps coordinate fundraising for grade 7 activities (camp, grad, and year-end activities)

g. Webmaster - Brian Yip

• updates the Weir PAC website www.weirpac.weebly.com

h. Media & Communication - Hailey Wong

• PAC website and weekly emails

i. Strings Program

- before-school violin program run by the PAC
- VSB-run Strings program ended 3 years ago due to budget cuts
- this is the 2nd year of Weir's PAC-run program
- 24 students (Gr 3 to 7) attend classes twice weekly, from 8am-8:45am
- Strings students perform at both Winter and Spring School Concerts

3. Fundraising: PAC raises funds for a variety of things for the school:

a. Playground purchase and maintenance

- after years of fundraising, PAC finally purchased and installed our Primary playground 2 years ago at a cost of \$50,000+
- funds need to be set aside for maintenance of the Primary + Intermediate playgrounds

b. Library Books

 2 to 3 Scholastic Book Fairs are held throughout the year to fundraise for the library

c. Classroom Funds

• \$250 per classroom teacher (18 this year) and \$125 per resource teacher (7 this year) for a total of **\$5,375.00** going towards your child's classroom this year

d. Technology program

- 2017/2018 school year, PAC purchased 14 new iPads, at a cost of almost \$4300
- 2018/2019 last year of iPad lease of almost \$6000
- provided smart boards and projectors for all classrooms by 2017/2018 school year

e. Gym equipment - \$500

• equipment that is used for Physical Education classes, and equipment that is used by the students at recess and lunch, and other times

f. Performing Arts - \$800

 Weir invites various arts groups to perform at the school for the students 2-3 times a year

g. Arts Fund - \$350

 art supplies for all the notice boards found around the school to display the students' art work and projects

h. Principal and Vice-Principal's Funds - \$500 each

these are discretionary funds

i. Year End Awards - \$500

• to recognize student achievement

j. Grade 7 Camp buses - \$1000

k. KSS Scholarship - \$700

• is split between one male and one female recipients who are graduating from Killarney Secondary, and had studied at Weir for at least 4 years

When all the above items that the PAC provides to the students and staff of Weir is added up, the PAC has an **operating budget** of **\$16,185.00**.

4. Fundraisers -To meet these obligations, PAC fundraises in the following ways:

a. Direct Donation campaign

- ongoing throughout the year
- donations over \$25 are tax deductible

b. Hot Lunch

• runs every Thursday, starting September 27th

c. Book Fair

- 2 Scholastic Book Fairs are held in the Fall and the Spring
- Weir holds a "Buy One Get One Free" one day sale at the end of the school year

d. Sports Day

funds raised through hot lunch and concession sales

e. Movie Nights

- funds raised through concession sales
- 2-3? movie nights this year; first to be in October

f. Spirit Wear

- sold Weir Wolves logo black t-shirts with great success last year
- propose to sell red dri-fit type t-shirts this year (after Dec)

g. NEW! Purdy's Chocolates

winter fundraiser from Nov-Dec



h. Other possible fundraisers

- gift cards are very labour intensive for very low returns, but may offer a limited selection (most popular) for winter fundraising (Nov-Dec)
- White Spot gift cards Hailey will inquire if this fundraiser is available only at Christmas or is offered throughout the year (perhaps a Spring fundraiser)
- local businesses or parents with businesses may offer gift cards eg. Famous Foods

5. New Business:

- a. Munch-a-Lunch Marsella Lim
 - introduction of on-line ordering to Weir school will make lunch ordering easier for parents, they will receive reminders of upcoming lunches, and going paperless is better for the environment

b. PAC Box

- new this year, a steel 'mailbox' is being installed outside the office so that Hot Lunch
 payments, movie night money, etc. can be dropped off in a secure location, and relieve
 teachers from having to collect PAC funds in the classroom
- 6. Principal and Vice-Principal Updates:

Ms. Gascoigne

- Thanked newcomers for coming out, and encouraged new parents to come out and participate
- Weir was the first Vancouver school to adopt the Bring Your Own Device program for grades 4-7
- Weir is scheduled to undergo seismic upgrading in 2 years
- the large number of combination classes this year was necessary to accommodate designated students and class size limits
- Senior Soccer has started and the co-ed team is being coached by Coach Dan (parent),
 Ms. Hsu, and Mr. Chai

Ms. Cindy Neufeld - new Vice-Principal at Weir this year

- an administrator for many years, previously a principal in Williams Lake
- enjoying the school, staff, and students
- 2 parent/teacher conferences occur during the year
