- potential damage to playgrounds after seismic construction? Who would be liable? VSB or Weir?
- Heather mentioned that for future playground structure in the case of replacement down the road to consider an "all sizes are welcome" type of playground instead of structures that cater only to primary or intermediate students as she has noticed that older students tend to not play on them as much after Grade 5. (most are on the field playing soccer, etc.)
 - le. younger students on intermediate playground are getting hurt (3 broken arms in the last 5 years)
- Riley mentioned an excellent & accessible playground structure for all ages at Mount Pleasant Elementary recently upgraded
- New site has wiring put in by the Board for a sound system in the gym, but they do not provide the sound system; may need PAC funds to purchase one
- Projector screen for new gym

Hailey thanked the 2021-2022 executive and volunteers for all their time and effort during the school year to make the hot lunch program run smoothly. Without them, coordinating pickup and delivery to 3 different sites would have been very difficult.

*Important to note: several of the Executive members and Committee Leaders will be "graduating out" with their children next year, and those vacated positions will need to be filled in order to continue to provide Weir students with many of the programs they now enjoy. At the first meeting in the fall, we need to bring that to the forefront, especially to the new incoming Kindergarten & primary grade parents so they can join and learn from those who have been volunteering for many years.

7. Principal & Vice-Principal's Updates

Thank you from admin for families' flexibility in regards to return date to new site:

- Projected finish date of the new building could be anywhere from the end of September –
 Remembrance Day weekend (mid-November)
- Movers require a 3-day weekend for all 3 sites to move back; the Pro D day in November provides a cushion for all staff to get set up, unpack, etc.
- Unknown factors causes delay: construction hours, supply shortages

School Annual Fees Schedule – office will send this out in September

Anticipated Fees – some items may change or be omitted

- \$35 school supplies
- \$20 performance fees (to bring in performances for whole school to enjoy throughout the year)
- \$8 planners
- \$20 licence fees ie. Mathletics, Raz-Kids
- Field-trip fees are at the discretion of classroom teachers
- **A must-have performance (Heather's recommendation after seeing it at MacCorkindale: "Release the Rhythm" \$800 Diversity, Inclusivity, engaging for all ages

Grade 7 Camp

- Teachers reported activities brainstormed reflects the wishes of Grade 7 students
- Proposing splitting up dates of Grade 7 camp starting next school year: 1 day in September (3rd week) for team building, 1 day at the end of June for celebration instead of the traditional 1 overnight stay (2 days total)
- Sasamat Camp still the preferred camp site a bit on the pricier end, but worth it
- Family Tea during the day instead of a ceremony where everyone feels obligated to dress up; not so formal, less ceremonial

Contingent upon date of return

Carleton Elementary Catchment Border Redrawn – effective 2023

• Currently most Carleton students are at Cunningham; when the fire happened 5 years ago, some students relocated to MacCorkindale

- the proposal is to divide the Carleton catchment into 3 parts which will expand the Cunningham, Weir and MacCorkindale catchments.
- Considerations: prioritize convenience and choice for VSB families, optimize the use of seismically safe space at Weir, safe travel to school
- Very good news for Weir: means increase in enrollment as early as Fall 2023
- No change for the 2022-2023 school year

First In-Person Assembly – Wednesday June 22 @ 1:30pm-2:30pm

- All 3 sites will be together for the 1st time in 2 years
- Program includes: strings performances, Grade 7 speeches, year-end slide show, good-byes to staff (Ms. Yeo supervision aide, Ms. Gascoigne)

All brand-new furniture at Weir!

- all old existing furniture will be left at swing sites
- Flexible arrangements (ie. tables that flip & have white boards on them for, furniture on wheels)
- Kam Sahota & Vanessa Adrian looking into outdoor education grants
- New building has 19 classrooms; currently have 15 divisions lots of opportunity to grow in enrollment

Miscellaneous: despite the drop in enrollment over the past 2 years, Weir has maintained all the staffing at 3 sites (added supervision aide); Heather thanks the generosity of the Board
