Proficiency Scale

- Describes learning in a different way
- Analogy: getting a driver's licence: learning rules of the road, safety rules, practicing driving
- Emerging, Developing, Proficient, Extending: will take time to understand

Foundation Skills Assessment (FSA) - taken in October

- Partly on paper, partly online
- Fraser Institute misuses information to rank schools: a private conservative think tank organization - have no effect on our school's funding in any way
- Gr. 4 \& 7 students
- Standardized assessment
- Helps schools and district monitor student growth and achievement in core academic skills
- Administered by students' teachers
- VSB students core quite well but typically very low student participation (especially among Indigenous and ELL students)

Reasons to exempt students:

- Level 1 and 2 ELL students
- Students with IEP's whose learning goals vary from age-level peers by two years or more
- Students with extended absences or extenuating circumstances
- Parents excuse their child

VSB School Board Policy 17: SOGI protests

- Main concern is for the safety of all kids; that all children have a right to be safe in schools and be visible


## VSB Food 4 School Program

- Designed to help children who require nutrition services at school due to financial barriers with food access
- Students are determined by the school Principal based on need
- Food preferences/special diets are not accommodated although vegetarian options are offered each day


## Parent Questions:

Utensils Shortage from veggie program day: PAC will have a meeting to discuss purchasing some common items (cups, plates, etc.)
Bringing food into school: pre-packaged foods are ok

## Strings Program Update?

- Summary from Riley: during seismic upgrade, Killarney strings and choir teacher taught the 6/7s when students were physically at Killarney
- Mr. Dodds \& Ms. Korf are the music teachers: all students are getting music education
- No extracurricular program at the moment run by PAC

Are there extracurricular language programs?

- No

Proficiency scale: what was the thought process from letter grades to scale?

- False sense of security with grades
- Scale: more descriptive of the skills students are able to do
- Ministry put out a pilot 5 years ago
- Values PROCESS over PRODUCT: promotes understanding of the material over putting emphasis on the end result
- The scale is flexible enough for diverse learners: neutral of the task that shows the thinking


## Split classes

- Teachers teach to where the kids are at; even if it's a straight grade class, there is still a wide spectrum of abilities within the same grade
- Benefits of a split class: leadership roles for the older students, classes are balanced due to many factors

Cross country team?

- No cross country team
- Volleyball \& track and field (grades 4-7)
- Looking for a volunteer soccer coach for grade 6/7s

Healthier food choices for hot lunch?

- PAC is looking for vendors and looking into different options

Why the cost increase?

- Food vendors' prices have all gone up
- PAC will monitor the volume of this first round of orders

Assemblies - can parents attend?

- Last year was the first year back onsite at Weir, and was first year being student-run, therefore Riley didn't want to advertise openly but parents are always welcome
- Riley will include assembly dates in the newsletter email
- Recognition assemblies happen every month on a Wednesday
